FAKE LE CREUSET CHECKLIST

O- Price

Le Creuset's most popular piece of cookware for their Enameled Cast Iron Signature 5.5-quart Round Dutch oven is around \$350. If you see a new one for the amazing price of \$50 – be wary.

O-Color

A genuine Le Creuset will have a vivid exterior color and a light sand interior. Some have a gradient color blend while others are a single color.

O- Enamel

Enamel layers are the next tell tail sign of a genuine Le Creuset as there are at least 3 layers of enamel coating applied to their cookware.

O-Rims

Although the rims of this cast iron cookware are dark grey or black, the color of bare cast iron, they will be covered with layers of clear baked-on enamel coating.

• Markings

Le Creuset stamps its brand name, where the pot is made "France" as well as size identifying letters, and numbers on the bottom of cookware pieces.

O- Lids

The cast iron lids have the brand name along with prominent rings on their exterior. The spacing and position of the rings have changed over time.

O- Knobs

The knobs on lids will be embossed with the brand name.

• Warranty

Le Creuset offers a lifetime warranty on most of its products you will not find that will a fake Le Creuset.

O- Vintage

When buying vintage anything sellers may try to command a VINTAGE price. If you are satisfied that it is an authentic Le Creuset and are willing to pay the asking price – go ahead.

Brand

Remember the Le Creuset brand commenced production in 1925 and identifying markings have changed throughout the years.
